[6] Sam Riffice, Florida (d. Siphosothando Montsi, Illinois, 6-2, 6-0)

"I feel very fortunate to be moving on into the quarterfinals over a great player from Illinois. With all the coaches help I feel as though my game is improving with each match and I am excited for another great opportunity tomorrow."

[4] Valentin Vacherot, Texas A&M (d. Rinky Hijikata, North Carolina, 6-2, 3-6, 6-3)

"I played a really solid first and third set. I did not let him believe he was in the match breaking him early. He changed his tactic in the second set and served really well which got me in trouble but I bounced back well."

[3] Emma Navarro, Virginia (d. Meg Kowalski, Georgia, 6-1, 6-1)

"I feel really good. I definitely didn't play my best the first two rounds but I brought a higher level today so I'm happy about that and I'm looking forward to tomorrow."

Can't really close it out in two; I had my opportunities in the first set and was down 4-3 in the second but I battled back, won that set, and got out to a 5-0 lead in the third and eventually closed it out. I'm really happy to have gotten it done today, more tough conditions in the heat, but I think that spending a couple weeks out here has really helped me and I'm just really excited for doubles tonight as well."
