Men's Quarterfinal: Recap and Quotes

#3 FLORIDA def. #6 BAYLOR, 4-0

ORLANDO, Fla. – The quarterfinal finale at the NCAA Division I Men's Tennis Championships concluded with No. 3 Florida taking the victory against No. 6 Baylor to advance on to the semifinal. The Gators swept the Bears in a 4-0 contest.

The Gators and the Bears, who had not faced each other since the 2012-13 season, started the doubles point with tight scores until Johannes Ingildsen and McClain Kessler captured a win for Florida in a 7-5 victory at No. 1. Oliver Crawford and Alfredo Perez secured the 1-0 lead after finishing their match against Will Little and Matias Soto in a 6-4 decision at the No. 2 position.

With singles underway, No. 6 McClain Kessler was the first to take home a point, with No. 5 Andy Andrade following shortly behind. The final point was grabbed by No. 2 Sam Riffice, who defeated Mateo Soto, 6-3, 6-4.

Florida, who had made it to the quarterfinals last year before succumbing to a close match against Ohio, hasn't seen the semifinals of the NCAAs since head coach Bryan Shelton took over the program in 2012.
